Open Document Format (ODF)

- ODF is an XML based document file format for
 - saving and exchanging editable office documents
 - including memos, reports, and books
 - spreadsheets, charts and presentations.

Impacts of Using ODF

- Better options for document access
- Cutting out `vendor lock-in'
- Greater choice among vendor selection
- Promise for supporting innovation
- Low cost of switching

Global Scenario

- Governments across the globe are giving ODF serious considerations
- Thirteen nations across the globe are planning for adapting to ODF
- A number of other governments have started providing active support to usage of ODF by encouraging end-users

DoIT GoNCT Delhi

- Created in 2000
- Was playing major role in enabling other departments and offices for adapting to IT and ensuring proper usage of IT
- Was playing pivotal role in a number of citizencentric projects
- Was in line with the government's vision of Bhagidari – citizen-government partnership

Use of IT in Gov. of Delhi

- Usage of IT across departments was going up
- In 2004 total IT related procurement against
 52 orders was Rs. 73.5 Lakhs

 In 2005 total IT related procurement against 117 orders was Rs. 352 Lakhs

Approx **379%** increase in IT procurement

Circular by IT Secretary

- On 30-Nov-05 Secretary (IT), Delhi issued a circular to encourage use of OpenOffice
- Prohibited purchase of licensed Office suite across all departments, even on demand
- Acted as the enabler for managing this change by asking clarifications to be directed to DoIT
- Main reason for taking this decision was cost-cutting

- Super speciality hospital Institute of Liver and Biliary Services (with a budget of Rs. 3.5 billion) will use Open Standards

Challenges faced by DoIT

- Inertia to change
- Particularly from large departments with more than 400 employees
- Ease of recruiting staff who are highly conversant with Open Standards
- Strong support system to be in place
- Less awareness
- More of training institutes to be supported so that man power is available at market rates

Economic Advantage

- Huge savings on cost
- Particularly for projects that will have large number of users
- No vendor lock in

Economic Advantage

- In case of perfect competition, market determines the price
- Local innovations can be supported at low cost
- Better sustaining capability due to presence of many players

Economic Advantage

- Competition will also determine that enhanced products reaches customer in right time and not the other way round
- One bold step towards citizen centric policies
- Boon for nurturing ICT enabled economy

- Unless people start using Open Standard software in their home PCs, it will be difficult for them to avoid the inertia to change at their workplace
