Minister of Communication and Information Technology Tifatul Sembiring, delivering his opening address at the Global Conference on Open Source on Monday, said the government must focus on developing open source software domestically, as open source software offers unlimited opportunities for local businesses and human resources in the information and communications industry and reduce government spending on software.

The government introduced a campaign in 2004 called “Indonesia, Go Open Source” (IGOS). The effort was fueled in part by the obligatory use of legal software, as defined in the 2002 Law on Intellectual Property Rights. Lolly Amalia Abdullah, the director of system information said, “We expect to build momentum for the growth of the national information and communication technology industry, and to promote Indonesia’s leadership in the field, especially in open source, to the international community.”
