Spirit of Merapi

As we all know, Merapi, one of the most active volcanoes in the world, erupted massively on 26 October 2010. On 4 November 2010, the mountain erupted again and it did not stop erupting over the next 100 hours. The pyroclastic materials getting spewed out to 5,000 meters high and destroying the areas where they flowed through, volcanic ash getting ejected far into tens of kilometers from the top of the mountain, all of these reminded people of a previous eruption back in 1872 with the same great intensity.

The story did not stop there. Until end of February 2011, the frequent rains transported lahars to the rivers on the flanks of Mount Merapi which destroyed a number of important bridges and cut off the route between Yogyakarta-Magelang.

Due to this disaster, hundreds of people have lost their lives, thousands of people have lost homes and livelihoods, hundreds of hectares of land have been badly damaged with an estimated economic loss at around IDR 7 trillion.

Behind all those sad stories, solidarity and great care emerged among all members of the public, whether among the local community, the Indonesian people or the world community. These have sparked new hope for a better future among the people affected by the volcanic activities.

It is the belief of Universitas Gadjah Mada as an institution inseparable from the development of the people of Yogyakarta that new knowledge will arise from the disaster. New opportunities came out for further research and exploration. UGM has developed dozens of researches that lead to the same goal, which is to help the communities at Merapi to be able to live in harmony and prosperity with Mount Merapi.



There are currently 68 undergraduate programs, 23 diploma programs, 104 master programs, and 43 doctorate programs.

The University is located in The Special Region of Yogyakarta, one of the smallest provinces in the country, which has been widely known as the center of Javanese culture as well as the center of learning. It has 3,200,000 inhabitants, 511,000 of whom reside in the city of Yogyakarta. The Special Region of Yogyakarta focuses its development on three inseparable pillars: education, culture, and tourism.

Research and Community Services Achievements

In line with Universitas Gadiah Mada (UGM) Strategic Plan 2008-2012, the vision of UGM is to be a world class research university, which is competitive, independent, respectable, and based on Pancasila in offering services for the sake of nation's needs towards its prosperity. The vision is realized through the mission in research based education and community services. More specifically, the missions carried out by UGM are: 1. To improve world class education, research, and community empowerment, that rooted on community and Indonesian socio-cultural development, 2. To complete the transitional phase of UGM towards independent university implementing good management practices. Based on the stated vision and mission, the basic principles as the foundation for strategies and policies with respect to research and community services are: 1. Continual quality improvement, 2. Extension of collaboration and network, 3. Institutional capacity building, and 4. Good management practices.

The aforementioned basic principles are further interpreted by The Institute for Research and Community Services (LPPM) UGM into five main programs, which are: 1. Research quality management and assurance, 2. Management of database and communication of research and community services, 3. Industrial research development and services, 4. Extension of national and international collaboration network, and 5. Community empowerment through the program of Student Community Services-Community Empowerment Learning (SCS-CEL) and empowerment of micro, small, and medium enterprises. These five main programs are run by five divisions whose names are similar to their corresponding main programs.

In research, UGM have been facilitating all research activities, which are grouped into 4 Research Clusters. These Research Clusters are namely Science and Technology Cluster, Health and Medicine Cluster, Agriculture Cluster, and Social and Humanity Cluster. These four clusters have been developing multidisciplinary collaborations, which are notably competitive and internationally recognized. Through these interdisciplinary and competitively scientific researches, UGM researchers have marked their existence in the globalization of knowledge and technology. In the last 5 years, the productivity of UGM researchers was shown by in average 900 research projects per year and 1000 research publications per year.

Some internationally recognized achievements in research have been shown by UGM researchers. Among those achievements are research on wood that has been acknowledged by the Japan Wood Research Society (JWRS)


in the 2009 JWRS Progress Award. Recently Japan Society of Applied Electromagnetics and Mechanics (JSAEM) has granted 2009 Young Engineer Award for a young UGM researcher for research in Magnetorheology. In biotechnology, Nagoya International Orchid Congress (NIOC) acknowledged UGM researcher achievement in orchid research by awarding 2009 Encouraged Award. Moreover, the expertise of UGM researchers have been recognized by international scientists. One example is the 2009 Pediatric Award that has been granted to one of the medical faculties. The award was granted by the Asian Pacific Pediatric Association (APPA).

The international patents achieved by the UGM researchers in the health and medicine field have brought its internationally competitive quality. The universal acknowledgement is shown by the WHO's adoption of handling protocol for children with diarrhea in hospital proposed by lecturers of the Medical Faculty, UGM, as well as by UNDP's adoption of methods of handling social conflicts. Many joint researches have been done by UGM researchers in collaboration with researchers from prominent universities in the world for biomedical sciences and social humanities subjects respectively.

UGM has been well known for its high achievements in community services. Every year, UGM deploys more than 6000 students and 200 senior lectures/professors in SCS-CEL program. For its roles in community services, UGM was awarded by the United Nation University (UNU) on December 17, 2007, to become 1 among 74 RCEs (Regional Centers of Expertise) in the world, with the expertise of community/society empowerment. Becoming one of the RCEs proved that activities of research based community services implemented through SCS-CEL program have obtained international acknowledgement. Up to year 2010. the number of foreign students who participated in SCS-CEL program has reached around 300. They came from Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brunei Darussalam, China, Egypt, England, France, Germany, Japan, Malaysia, Namibia, New Zealand, Norway, Russia, South Korea, Thailand, and United States.

The concept and implementation of green campus that has been followed up, among others, include the vision of educopolis campus, which is an environment that is conducive to the learning process in the context of the development of multidisciplinary collaborations and responsive to ecological issues in order to achieve the university vision. ENTRY PROCEDURES FOR COURSES AND EXTENSIONS

General entry requirements:

- meet all academic standard required by Indonesian universities;
- 2. receive offer of admission from the Indonesian Higher Education Office;
- 3. submit a statement of source of funding for Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral courses;
- 4. submit medical statement issued by home country's recognized doctor or hospital;
- 5. submit a statement saying that the applicant agrees to comply with Indonesian university regulations.

Specific entry requirements:

All international students intending to study in Indonesian universities for academic programs, professional course work, language and cultural classes or practical training programs should provide the following documents:

- 1. an offer of admission from the university.
- 2. a letter of recommendation from the Indonesian Embassy Officials.
- 3. a curriculum vitae or resume.
- 4. a certified copy of secondary level certificate/diploma and academic transcripts.
- 5. a statement on source of funding or bank statement.
- 6. a copy of valid passport.
- 7. a statement saying that the applicant agrees not to work during the course of study in Indonesia, and to comply with Indonesian law and regulations.
- 8. a letter of sponsorship from Indonesian institutions/agencies or family in Indonesia supporting the student's intention to study.
- 9. a red-background, passport-size (4 cm X 6 cm) photo.
- 10. a medical statement issued by home country's authorized institutions or hospitals.

Students undertaking practical training programs should also submit a letter of recommendation from Indonesian universities or institutes where they study.

Extended study permit:

Should a student need to extend his/her period of study in Indonesia, the university should request an extended study permit from the Directorate General of Indonesian Higher Education. Supporting documents for obtaining the extended study permit are as follows:

- 1. a student's academic progress report
- 2. Police registration card (SKLD) from the local Police Station.
- 3. a copy of valid passport.
- 4. a copy of Limited Stay Permit in Indonesia (KITAS)
- 5. a curriculum vitae or resume.
- 6. a statement on source of funding or bank statement.

Procedures to get Visas:

We strongly suggest you that to visit Indonesia, you do not use visas other than the temporary stay visa (commonly called VITAS), because inconveniences may occur. For example, if your stay is for study purpose, which requires the VKSB (Visa Kunjungan Sosial Budaya/Social and Cultural Visit Visa), you will normally be granted a permit for 2 month's stay. You will, however, need to extend your visa at your local immigration office every month for the whole duration of 6 months. Furthermore, you will have to apply for a new visa from the nearest Indonesian Embassy (this means that you will have to leave Indonesia) after 6 month's stay.

Procedures to apply for student visas:

- Applicants submit the application and all supporting documents stated in the specific entry requirements directly to intended university or institute.
- 2. Should an applicant receive an offer of admission, the university becomes the applicant's facilitator or sponsor during his/her period of study in Indonesia.
- 3. The university sends a covering letter requesting study permit for the applicant and all supporting documents to the Directorate General of the Indonesian Higher Education.
- 4. The Directorate General of the Indonesian Higher Education recommends the applicant's academic standing to the Bureau of Foreign Affairs and Public Relations (BKLN) and the Secretariat General of the Ministry of National Education.
- 5. The Bureau of Foreign Affairs and Public Relations (BKLN) and the Ministry of National Education and all related departments discuss and review the applicant's documents in a Clearing House discussion forum.
- 6. The Bureau of Foreign Affairs and Public Relations (BKLN) and the Ministry of National Education grant a permit for the applicant and send a permit letter to the university concerned. A copy is sent to the applicant as well.
- Applicants already residing in Indonesia may directly apply to the universities and submit all necessary supporting documents listed earlier.



Visa types and application procedures for stay permit:

A. Types of visas for staying in Indonesia:

- 1. Diplomatic Visa
- 2. Work Visa
- Tourist Visa
- 4. Socio-cultural Visa

5. Limited Stay Visa

The appropriate visas for international students who wish to study in Indonesia is the Limited Stay Visa. This is issued by the Directorate General of the Immigration Office in Jakarta (see Stay Permit Application Procedures?).

av permit: extension of the I

The university will regularly request an extension of the KITAS of its international students on a yearly basis from the local immigration office based on the duration of the permit. The University will forward the KITAS to the Directorate General of Higher Education.

How to extend stay permit

Arrangement of KITAS for international students studying in institutions which are not under the National Education Ministry will be handled by the institutions themselves.

Once the extended stay permit is granted, the international students should obtain the SKLD.

B. Application procedures for Limited Stay Visas.

There are two ways in obtaining Limited Stay Visas for international students who wish to study in Indonesia.

 International students who are still in their country of origin and will visit Indonesia with the Limited Stay Visa (VITAS)/one year visa

Procedure:

- a. After the issuance of study permit by the Foreign Affairs Bureau and the National Education Ministry, the university requests a Limited Stay Visa (VITAS) for international students from the Directorate General of Immigration in Jakarta. The University or its representative can help arrange the Limited Stay Visa (VITAS) if students submit:
- 3 passport-size photographs
- a copy of valid passport
- a curriculum vitae or resume
- b. The Director General of Immigration issues the Limited Stay Visa (VITAS) through the Indonesian embassy/consulate in their home country
- c. International Students apply for the Limited Stay Visa (VITAS) through the Indonesian embassy/consulate in their home country
- d. With the Limited Stay Visa (VITAS), international students may visit Indonesia and the university concerned.
- e. The university submits the Limited Stay Visa (VITAS) and requests the Limited Stay Permit(KITAS) from the local Immigration office and Police registration card (SKLD) from the local Police Station

- Applicants visiting Indonesia with the Social-Cultural Visit Visa (valid for 30 or 60 days and extendable for a maximum of 4 x 1 month, for a total of 6 months?)
 - a. Applicants may use the Social-Cultural Visit Visa from Indonesian embassy/consulate and the study permit to enroll in the university.
 - b. If the applicant is admitted, the university will request a study permit from the Ministry of National education
 - c. After the study permit has been issued, the university will request the local immigration office to convert the immigration status of the Social-Cultural Visit Visa to the VITAS..
 - d. The head of the Local immigration office will send the conversion proposal to the Immigration Central Office in Jakarta through the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights.
 - e. The Immigration Central Office in Jakarta can only give approval on the conversion request after the students have stayed for 2 months.
 - f. Subject to approval for conversion, students may apply for the KITAS from the local immigration office and the Police registration card from the local Police Station.

If, as a foreign researcher, you wish to do a research in Indonesia, you have to apply for a research permit to your research counterpart. This is normally an institute or a body connected to your research such as the Indonesian Institute of Science (LIPI)Ministry of Research and Technology (RISTEK) or a counterpart from any university in Indonesia. If no sponsor is available for your research, LIPI is willing to act as your sponsor upon request. In order to obtain a visa to conduct a research, your research proposal must be approved by the Ministry of Research and Technology (RISTEK).

The cost for obtaining the research permit and/or the researcher visa is US\$ 100. For further information please visit http://www.ristek.go.id or email to: frp@ristek.go.id.



Living Cost in Yogyakarta

Weather

Yogyakarta has a warm tropical climate with two seasons; wet and dry. The wet season lasts from October to March and the heaviest rains occur in December and January. The temperature throughout the year averages from 24° to 31° C (80° to 87° F) and the humidity averages about 75%.

Electricity

The electricity system in Indonesia runs 220V at A 50 Hz (European Standard). Equipment with 110 V at AC50 Hz (American Standard) will need an adaptor or step down transformer of some kind.

Money Changer and Banks

Most hotels from three to five star provide foreign currency exchange services. There are also numerous money changers in the Malioboro area. Local Banks provide a full international service, including money transfer, Visa, Master Card, Cirrus, Alto networks. These are the contact numbers of some credible local banks: Bank BNI (+62-274-387751), Bank Mandiri (+62-274-586425), Bank BCA +62-274-517282), Bank BII (+62-274-561416), and Bank Niaga (+62-274-565338).





Public Transportation

There are many different modes of public transportation available like pedicab, horse and cart, ojek (cheap 2 wheel taxis), taxis and city buses. Most students use bikes, motorcycles & buses for their transportation needs. It is save to cycle, go by pedicab or horse and cart, as Yogyakarta's terrain is flat and the roads are paved.

Travel Documents

A valid passport and Visa are required when visiting Indonesia. There are a range of visas that can be applied for at your closest Indonesian Embassy: tourist visa, study visa, and cultural visa. Study and business visas have a validity of one year (can be extended annually) and tourist visas have a validity of one month.

Accommodation and Cost of Living

There is a wide range of housing options available with reasonable prices including university operated housing. The cost of living in Yogyakarta is significantly lower than other major cities in Indonesia.
