Release Notes

- V3375 is to fix an inadvertent error in v2511 that caused it to time out in April.

Version 2511 notes:

- Initial release of vSpace for Ubuntu 8.10. This version replaces our beta release for L-series based on OpenSUSE 10.2 v567, and supports the L130 and L230 access devices
- This version supports USB and microphone on the L230 (features not available on the OpenSUSE beta) with the following known errata.
 - After a system reboot, the first time a particular L230/L130 device hosts a user session, audio-output may not function on that device. Logging out of the session and immediately logging back in will enable the audio. Audio continues to work on that L-series device for subsequent user log-ins.
 - Under some circumstances, a user may hear noises similar to “scratched record pop” intermittently overlaying the regular audio output. Logging out of the session, manually changing the resolution setting on the user’s L230/L130 device, and logging back in from the same device eliminates the noise. You can then change the device resolution back to its original setting. Performing a power cycle on that L230/L130 device may cause the noise to return.
- Install should include a live internet access to install and to register. Ping register.ncomputing.com or 85.214.42.113 to verify that the registration server is accessible through the local network. Off line registration can be done via email except for one erratum. If v2511 is re-installed onto the same host, the off line registration will not take.
- Registration is required, and until both the vSpace software and the terminals are registered, the L-series access devices will operate in a 60 minute trial mode and the user session will exit (without warning) at the end of 60 minutes.
- Please read the Ubuntu 8_10 L-series Install Guide v2511 for information on vSpace install and set up steps.
